Technical Revocation Options for the Sentencing Courts

If an offender is eligible for a technical revocation according to the following checklist, the following options are available:

If any of the following are applicable, the offender is ineligible:		
Any offender released to supervision for the conviction of a crime of violence as defined in R.S. 14:2(B). Any offender released to supervision for the conviction of a sex offense as defined in R.S. 15:541. Any offender released to supervision who is subject to the sex offender registration and notification requirements of R.S. 15:541 et seq. Any offender currently under supervision for any of the following: o Not Guilty by Reason of Insanity o Sentenced to Home Incarceration under CCrP Art 894.2 o Incoming Interstate Compact Case o Medical Treatment Furlough.		
(Offender is NOT ELIGIBLE if the answer to any of the following is YES) Each period of supervision is counted separately.		
Being arrested for, charged with or convicted of a felony.	☐ YES	□ NO

(1) Don François Alternative Treatment Center (male and female)

90 day custodial substance abuse treatment and other rehabilitative programs in Concordia Parish for technical violators.

<u>Sentencing language:</u> "Probation is being revoked via Technical Revocation for 90 days to be served in the Don Francois Alternative Center." An alternative to this program only would be: "In lieu of revocation, the offender is being ordered to serve 90 days in the Don Francois Alternative Center." This option would allow the offender to serve the full 90 days in the program.

(2) Steve Hoyle Intensive Substance Abuse Program (male only)

90 day intensive custodial substance abuse treatment in Bossier Parish for technical violators.

<u>Sentencing language:</u> "Probation is being revoked via Technical Revocation for 90 days to be served in the Steve Hoyle Intensive Substance Abuse Program."

(3) Louisiana Transitional Center for Women (women only)

90 day custodial rehabilitative programs in Madison Parish for technical violators.

<u>Sentencing language:</u> "Probation is being revoked via Technical Revocation for 90 days to be served in the Louisiana Transitional Center for Women."

- It's worth noting that the offender shall be given credit toward service of his sentence for time spent in actual custody prior to the revocation hearing while being held for a technical violation.
- The probation officer will send the court minutes or uniform commitment order to DOC Headquarters. Courts
